



Review Battlefield V

EA DICE

Battlefield V is a new release from the DICE and Electronic Arts war franchise. In this installment all events unfold in World War II. The game is available for PlayStation 4, Xbox One, and computers. Offers a wide variety of multiplayer alternatives and a solo campaign

Battlefield V is a new installment of the acclaimed and renowned first person shooting war franchise developed by DICE alongside Electronic Arts. The game came out in November 2018 and is available for PlayStation 4, Xbox One, and computers through platforms like Steam or Origin.

The proposal takes us this time to World War II. All events, weapons, vehicles, factions and maps will be set in the warlike conflict that developed in the world until 1945. This historical context brings more modernity to the elements within the game compared to its predecessor Battlefield 1 of 2016, which was immersed in the universe of the First World War.

Like all games in the series, the highest and most developed point of Battlefield V is the **multiplayer mode**. Since the franchise's inception, this gaming alternative is why fans choose it and look forward to it.

In the new DICE title it is possible to experience a Battle Royale game or the traditional game options between users. For those who want to join the fashion of Fortnite or PUBG style, Battlefield V presents Firestorm. Here the players will have the mission to survive a ring of fire that closes progressively. The terrain is the largest in the history of EA titles, supports up to 64 players and can be played individually or in teams. During the game you must explore the territory to obtain the best weapons and thus fight and survive as a team. Vehicles are also available.

If what we are looking for are traditional games, when **downloading Battlefield V** we find a variety of game modes to enjoy with friends.. As expected, the traditional Conquest option is available in which 64 players face off to dominate strategic locations on the game's huge maps. This time the possibility of altering the terrain with constructions made by the players is added to benefit their team. Other options available in multiplayer are Squad Contest, Airborne, Breakthrough, Domination, Final Stand, Frontlines or Team Deathmatch.

Battlefield V also introduces a new way to interact with other people in Combined Arms. Here the players will have to fulfill missions in a cooperative way in which the enemy will be the AI. The maximum number of users is 4 and you can choose tasks such as eliminating a particular soldier, destroying a group of enemies, a specific artillery or stealing intelligence files from the opposite side. There are 10 different scenarios to choose from.

While Battlefield V users tend to stick to multiplayer, they also occasionally enjoy solo campaigns that tell a good story. In the latest release of the saga, you will be able to experience war stories that are based on stories and real events from World War II.

The single player campaign features all manner of voices, characters, and elements to explore various aspects of the historical event. The available missions are Nordlys, Tiralleur, Under No Flag and The Last Tiger. The arguments of each are very different.

In Nordlys we will put ourselves in the shoes of a young Norwegian who will fight for her nation and the safety of her family, we must use all kinds of tactics and stealth movements so as not to be discovered. The Tiralleur mission puts us in the shoes of Senegalese troops in a hectic infantry engagement. In Under No Flag we will live the redemption story of a former English prisoner and The Last Tiger plunges us into a war tank during the last days of the world conflict.

There are titles that do not disappoint and Battlefield V is one of them. We all know the potential that Dice games together with Electronic Arts bring from their first productions and, with the advancement of technologies, each new game in this franchise gets better and better. In the title set in World War II we have a wide variety of game modes that will undoubtedly give hours of entertainment, whether we want to play as a team or enjoy the exciting stories of individual campaigns.
